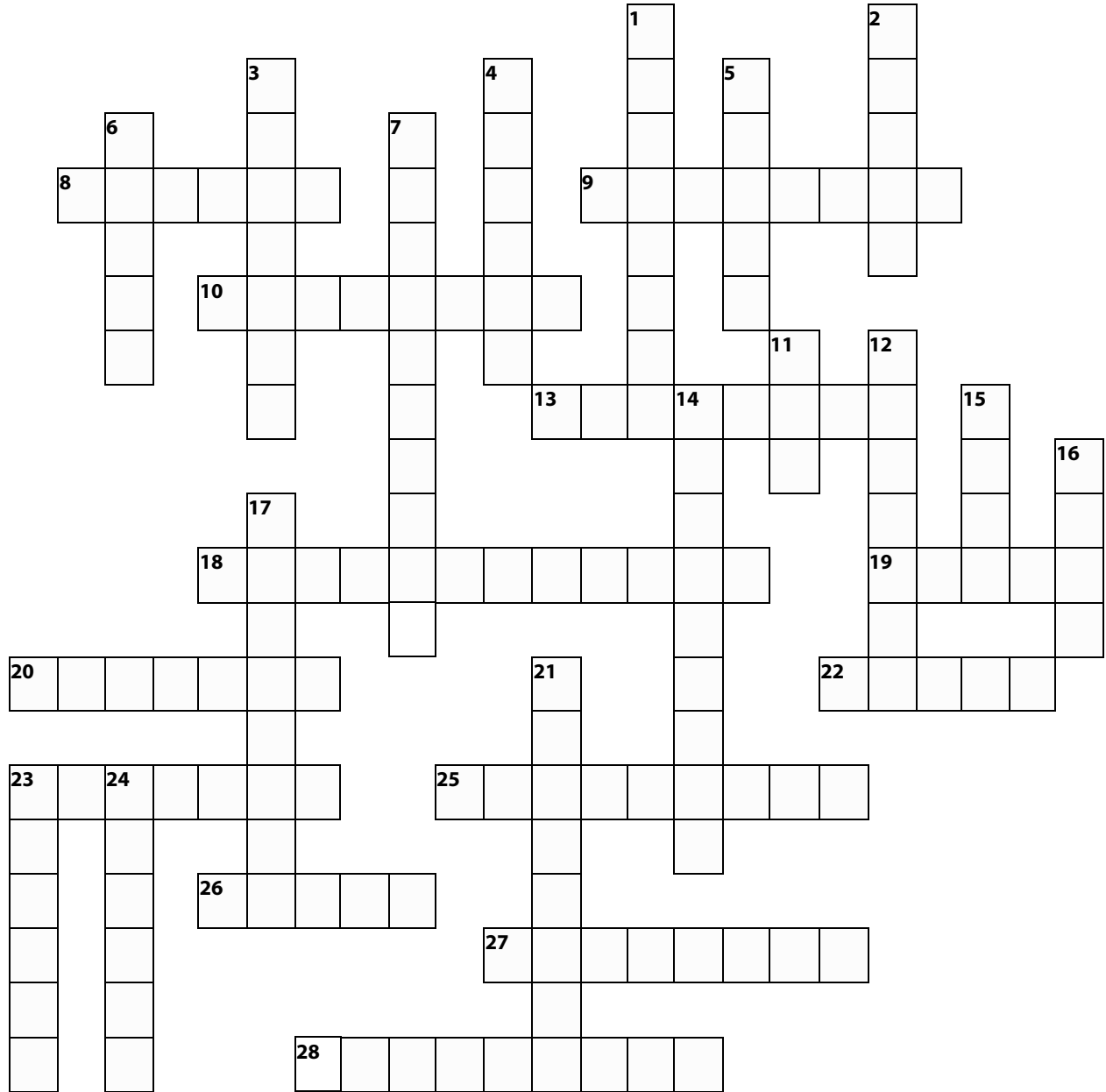

4. Once the back porch of a cottage on the Aldie property, this covered corridor is now an informational wall off the courtyard.
5. Arranged in a decorative pattern, the exterior walls of Aldie Mansion are made of this fired clay block.
6. County where Aldie Mansion is located.
7. Aldie Mansion has 5 of these ugly or comically distorted creatures on its roof.
11. Typical brick color.
12. Location of one of William Mercer's original fountains.
14. Heritage Conservancy welcomes its guests in this unroofed, walled area at the front of the mansion.
15. Used to enclose some gardens at Aldie Mansion.
16. Type of spaces Heritage Conservancy protects.
17. At Aldie Mansion, Heritage Conservancy recreated this shelter that has nest holes for domesticated pigeons or doves.
21. Aldie Mansion is an example of this aesthetic process that adapts buildings for new uses while retaining their historic features. (First of 2 words)
23. You can see this area of land, with native grasses and wildflowers, through the conservatory windows.
