

## **Animal Adaptations - Cottontail Rabbit**

## Supplies:

5 cotton balls glue clear tape crayons or colored pencils pine needles and twigs

## **Directions:**

- 1. Print out the picture of the cottontail rabbit on page 2 or draw your own. Do not cut it out as we will use the background in our project.
- 2. Take your cotton balls and pull them apart to create a lot of fluff.
- 3. Take this fluff and glue it onto the rabbit.
- 4. Let the fluff dry.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 and 3.
- 6. Now we will create a pine forest with twigs and pine needles. Line up the twigs close together on the background of your paper, like trees. Then glue them into place and allow to dry.
- 7. On top of and around the twigs add the pine needles with the clear tape like leaves. \*Make sure to save some of the pine needles for the next step.
- 8. With the extra needles, tape them down underneath the trees you just made.
- 9. To finish your project, color in the background and make a beautiful wintery scene by drawing snow and whatever you see outside of your window or what you imagine the rabbit's winter home to look like.



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
