We have protected more than 16,000 acres of open space, farmland, watershed areas, and wildlife habitat in Southeastern Pennsylvania.

Natural Resource Protection

Heritage Conservancy owns and manages approximately 1,500 acres of land, including farmland and fragile habitats. Through tree plantings, trash cleanups, habitat restoration, and invasive plant removal, we steward this land and protect its natural resources.

Several of our nature preserves offer public access, including hiking trails and open spaces. We also host public events and community science programs on these grounds to track local plants and wildlife.

Conservation Easements

Heritage Conservancy is a nationally accredited Land Trust.

We work with private landowners and municipalities to help conserve land and protect open spaces. Heritage Conservancy holds conservation easements on more than 250 properties in Bucks, Montgomery, and Northampton Counties, and we have helped facilitate over 100 more. These easements let landowners protect their property in perpetuity.

We share resources to help owners understand what makes their land special and how best to take care of it for themselves and the future.

COMMUNITY

Educational Outreach

Heritage Conservancy engages students of all ages in the natural world, extending an appreciation for nature and instilling a sense of environmental stewardship in the next generation.

We offer resources for teachers and parents: trainings and curriculum that support natural sciences, environmental literacy, watershed education, and social and emotional learning.

Our diverse program offerings support school curriculum and state standards while engaging students in hands-on, inquiry-based learning.

Community Engagement

We host a variety of outdoor and nature-themed events throughout the region, including hikes, birding expeditions, and volunteer events.

Through public programs, partnerships, and local relationship building, we work to ensure everyone feels at home outdoors and enjoys access to the natural world around them.



HISTORY

Historic Preservation

Heritage Conservancy offers programs and services that help to identify, evaluate, and protect our region's historic sites and properties – working with communities to preserve historic and cultural landscapes and resources that tell important local and national stories.

Our Register of Historic Places features over 700 properties. We also hold facade easements to protect historically important structures.

Aldie Mansion

We maintain William and Martha Mercer's 1920s home – part of Bucks County's artistic legacy and a model for the adaptive reuse of a historic building.
